3rd PARTNER MEETING – Spain

The SEA4SHORE project, funded by Erasmus+, held its 3rd Partner Meeting in Barcelona Spain, bringing together key stakeholders from six European countries to discuss progress and future developments in supporting seafarers' transition to shore-based careers.

Key Discussions and Achievements

1. Competency Mapping & Career Pathways

- Reviewed the Competency Map, covering 120 alternative shore-based career pathways.
- Discussed how maritime skills align with logistics, transport, renewable energy, and port management sectors.

3. Industry Engagement & Stakeholder Feedback

- Experts from the maritime industry, training institutions, and employment agencies shared insights on job market trends and skill gaps.

- Case studies of seafarers who successfully transitioned to shore-based careers were presented.

4. Future Steps & Dissemination

- Plans for the development phase of the digital tool have been prepared.
- Upcoming dissemination events will aim to raise awareness and engage more industry stakeholders.

SEA4SHORE is a collaborative initiative involving institutions from Latvia, Spain, Turkey, Lithuania, Greece, and Croatia, working towards a more sustainable and dynamic career transition model for seafarers. By providing structured competency frameworks and digital career tools, the project ensures that experienced maritime professionals can continue contributing to the sector in shore-based roles.
